Did You Know

That pictures of the Westbury White Horse are becoming widely available on cards and notelets? The water-colourist Eric Ravilious (1903 – 42) was fascinated by white horses and two of his paintings of our white horse are particularly well known (The Westbury Horse, 1939 and Train Landscape, 1940). There has been a resurgence of interest in Ravilious and a major exhibition of his work this year. You've probably all noticed that our horse is looking grubby again – but it's clean in the pictures!

That the Westbury White Horse was covered over during World War II? So Eric Ravilious may have been using his imagination for his pictures rather than painting from life.

That the 1939 Register is now available online? The Register was effectively a census, taken on 29th September 1939 just after the outbreak of World War II. It was used for issuing ID and ration cards and planning evacuations. It is now a valuable source for family historians. You can also use it to find out who was living in your house in 1939 (if your house is old enough). Occupancy rates were high: for instance, 10 people lived in 18/18A Westbury Leigh at the time! Update on the Car Park

It is taking a long time, but progress is being made on the drainage works and the subsequent community asset transfer of the car park to Westbury Leigh Community Project Ltd (the registered charity that runs the Community Hall).

Wiltshire Council have installed the metal lamppost with the asset transfer in mind: they last longer than concrete ones and there is less maintenance. So that's good for our community!
