Recycling in Westbury

Since April last year Wiltshire Wildlife Trust, in partnership with Wiltshire Council, has been working in Westbury schools and at local events to encourage residents to reduce their rubbish and re-use and recycle more.

You can make a difference to the amount of rubbish sent to landfill by recycling around the home - you could make a dedicated area for recycling in your kitchen, for example a separate bin or box?

Have you recycled all you can?



In your blue-lidded bin:

- **Plastic bottles** such as washing-up bottles, milk/fizzy drink and juice bottles, shampoo and cleaning product bottles (washed, squashed, lids on)
- **Cardboard** such as cereal and food boxes, ready meal sleeves, greetings cards, toilet rolls, corrugated card, brown paper and shredded paper

In your black box:

- **Drink cans**
- **Tin food cans**
- **Tin foil** including take-away food containers (clean!)
- **Aerosols** (empty)
- **Paper** such as junk mail, newspapers, magazines, envelopes (including those with windows), letters and telephone directories
- **Glass** bottles and jars (washed, lids on)
- **Clothes and textiles such as:** old clean clothes, pairs of shoes tied together, leather belts and handbags, curtains, sheets, blankets and duvet covers (put items in a plastic bag)

If you recycle a lot you can have a second black box free of charge - to order one, please contact the Council on 0300 4560102 or wasteandrecycling@wiltshire.gov.uk. If your blue-lidded bin lid is broken, please get in touch with the Council to get a new one.

Did You Know

That Westbury has a unique road name? It is Snappersnipes, a lane which runs alongside The Laverton. The name goes back to at least the mid-19th century (and is probably much older) and nobody seems to know where it comes from.

That the Church of the Holy Saviour in Westbury Leigh has a famous window? The east window (in the part of the building still used as a church) was designed by Christopher Rahere Webb, one of the most distinguished stained glass designers of the 20th century. It was installed in 1933. Webb also worked at St Denys in Warminster around that time.

That part of Westbury Leigh is actually in Dilton Marsh? The Biss Brook (running alongside Mill Lane and Bridge House) is the boundary between Westbury and the civil parish of Dilton Marsh, which was created in 1894.
